Part 3 – Alice (Ver 2.2 or 3 Beta) Alice is an innovative 3D programming environment that makes it easy to create an animation for telling a story, playing an interactive game, or a video to share on the web. Alice is a freely available teaching tool designed to be a student's first exposure to object-oriented programming. It allows students to learn fundamental programming concepts in the context of creating animated movies and simple video games. In Alice, 3-D objects (e.g., people, animals, and vehicles) populate a virtual world and students create a program to animate the objects.

Research Alice through reading and video tutorials. You are free to do your own “googling” but I have some links that will not only get you started, but will provide you with the background and understanding you will need to complete this Summer Assignment.
