

A Week in the Life of an AP Economics Student

Inside the Classroom:

We begin a new chapter every Monday. Students should have already read the chapter the weekend before. Monday starts the classroom notes on it. Homework problems will be assigned. All of the chapter and homework problems will be covered by Thursday. There will be review on Thursday accompanied by a study guide produced by a different student each week. Friday will be a test and then a new chapter will be assigned to read over the weekend.

Outside the Classroom:

Students are expected to read the chapters on their own. They are given study guides that follow along with the text. The study guides provide additional test questions and explanations. Students are expected to utilize these study guides on their own outside of the classroom. In addition, students are expected to complete any assignments given on time. On average, students spend about 6 hours a week outside of the classroom working on AP Economics.
