After choosing a translation (see me for a text or links), read each selection noted in this journal and choose quotations significant and interesting to you, in English, from the text. Write a thoughtful analysis which includes your honest reaction as you read. This packet contains 14 response pages, all of which must be completed before the first day of school.

In the fall, we will also lay out curricular themes inherent in the text. These curricular themes will form the basis for further discussion about our readings.
