Re: Student International Field Trips

The following student international travel trips for our secondary schools have been approved by the administration. In an effort to maintain consistent instructional practices, no staff or students will miss more than two (2) full days of school for any field trip.

At the October 26, 2004 meeting, the Board of Education lifted the ban on foreign travel and delegated the approval for such trips to the Superintendent of Schools.

The first day of Passover is March 31, 2018, with the last day of Passover being April 7, 2018. Good Friday will occur on March 30, 2018. Spring recess for staff and students begins on April 9, 2018 and ends on April 13, 2018.

#### FAIRFIELD WARDE and FAIRFIELD LUDLOWE HIGH SCHOOL

Destination: Quebec City (Canada)

Date of Trip: February 8-11, 2018

Estimated Cost of Trip: \$710 - \$820 (per person) Number of Students Attending: Approximately 40

Number of Chaperones: 6

A French immersion trip to experience the linguistic and cultural differences of French-speaking Canada as well as attend Quebec City's winter carnival.

#### FAIRFIELD WARDE and FAIRFIELD LUDLOWE HIGH SCHOOL

Destination: Madrid and Talavera Spain

FWHS Teacher Responsible: Andrea Hagenbach FLHS Teacher Responsible: Eileen Frankel

Date of Trip: April 5–14, 2018

Estimated Cost of Trip: \$2,900.00 (per person)

Number of Students Attending: Approximately 8-20

Number of Chaperones: 2-3

During this trip, students will have the opportunity to experience first-hand the culture and language of Spain. Students will be able to practice the language and they will share their experiences with classmates who did not participate.

#### **FAIRFIELD WARDE HIGH SCHOOL**

Destination: Italy – Sorrento and Rome

Date of Trip: April 6-14, 2018

Teacher Responsible: Amy Scatenato

Estimated Cost of Trip: \$3,300 (per person)

Number of Students Attending: Approximately 12-30

Number of Chaperones: 2 - 5

During this trip, students will experience the culture and art, ancient and modern, as well as the language of Italy. This trip as been designed to support the Latin, Italian and Art curricula by giving students of Latin a first-hand look at the ancient ruins in the regions of Campania and Lazio, by giving Italian students the opportunity to explore the language and culture of modern Italy in both a town (Sorrento) and a city (Rome), and by giving students of art exposure to the history of Western art from the Ancient Roman world through the Renaissance into the Modern world.

#### **FAIRFIELD LUDLOWE HIGH SCHOOL**

Destination: Paris, France
Date of Trip: April 5-12, 2018
Teacher Responsible: Donna Huber

Estimated Cost of Trip: \$3,775 (per person)

Number of Students Attending: Approximately 11 - 18

Number of Chaperones: 2 - 3

During this trip, students will experience evaluating textile use in designs, evaluating proper construction techniques, evaluate the roles of theories in the fashion movement and interpret fashion as an integrated global entity. They will prepare and evaluate recipes from a foreign country, observe and take part in a culinary institute classroom, students will participate in hands-on cooking classes in a culinary institute and observe and participate in the supply and distribution of foods in a foreign country. Students will share their learnings with other classes.

#### FAIRFIELD WOODS MIDDLE SCHOOL

Destination: Montreal, Canada Date of Trip: May 4-6, 2018

Teacher Responsible: Eileen Wargo Estimated Cost of Trip: \$480 (per person)

Number of Students Attending: Approximately 42 Number of Chaperones: 6 (includes parents)

During this trip, the students will study the various cultural sites of French-Canadian culture and will learn about food authentic to the culture as well.

#### ROGER LUDLOWE MIDDLE SCHOOL

Destination: Ecuador - Quito, Tena, Banos

Date of Trip: April 9-17, 2018

Teacher Responsible: Richard Haxhi

Estimated Cost of Trip: \$3,100 (per person)

Number of Students Attending: Approximately 15

Number of Chaperones: 17 (includes parents)

During this trip, the students will be exposed to geographical concepts linked to their curriculum; physical systems, human systems and human environment interaction.

#### ROGER LUDLOWE MIDDLE SCHOOL

Destination: Spain - Madrid, Segovia, Toledo, Barcelona, Girona, Montserrat

Date of Trip: April 4-13, 2018 Teacher Responsible: Gjorgj Krogi

Estimated Cost of Trip: \$2,700 (per person)

Number of Students Attending: Approximately 40

Number of Chaperones: 15

Concert tour – The learning experience would be combined with 4 important performances at interesting locations combined with people-to-people experiences enabling interaction and joint performances by the RLMS Grade 8 and RLMS Chamber Orchestra with young Spanish instrumentalists at similar age in Madrid and Barcelona.
