COURSE DESCRIPTION

This is a two semester, two credit course. It is intended for a student who has successfully completed Latin 20. In this course students continue to develop the reading skills acquired in their previous years of Latin study. During Latin 31, students are exposed to authentic texts by authors such as Catullus, Ovid, Martial and Caesar. The second semester of Latin 31 is designed specifically to introduce students to texts that will be studied further in A.P. Latin and Latin 41.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

How do the Romans perceive themselves? Students will continue to follow the life of the character Quintus Caecilius back to Rome as they explore more of the political landscape of the first century C.E. History written by the Roman prose writer, Tacitus, forms the backbone of the first half of the course. The second half introduces students to authentic prose and poetic texts by authors of the late Republic and early Principate. With the further development of their vocabulary and grammar skills, more complex reading passages will serve to foster greater competence in translating.
